Sr. No.	Guidelines for Assessment

4	Individual assessment agencies will create unique question papers for theory part for each candidate at each examination/training center (as per assessment criteria below).
5	Individual assessment agencies will create unique evaluations for skill practical for every student at each examination/training center based on this criterion.
6	To pass the Qualification Pack, every trainee should score a minimum of 50% in aggregate marks to successfully clear the assessment
